SOUTH EAST NEW ENERGY PROGRAMME

The South East New Energy Programme is led by the University of East London and part funded by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF).

The programme is offering funding to eligible SMEs, towards energy efficiency and renewable energy projects. Examples of priority projects are LED lighting, variable speed drives, voltage optimisation systems and infrared heating.

Projects must be completed and paid for before the end of June 2023 so potential applicants are encouraged to <u>contact PECT</u>, who are facilitating the SENE Grant Scheme.

You can also <u>register</u> to attend weekly grant scheme briefings, held at 3:30pm every Wednesday.



PROGRESS CONTINUES WITH ADVANCED WORKS FOR NEW CHELMSFORD NORTH EAST BYPASS



Advanced enabling works continue to progress ahead of the construction of the planned <u>Chelmsford North East Bypass</u>.

The enabling works involve building a bridge, which will ultimately span the new bypass and enable the continued operation of an existing mineral quarry, Bulls Lodge, during construction and operation of the bypass.

Piling works at the site have been completed and deep drainage has been installed to run beneath the embankments.

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL SUCCESSFUL IN WINNING £1 MILLION ACTIVE TRAVEL CAPABILITY FUNDING

Essex County Council have been awarded £1 million of Capability Funding to help plan and develop walking and cycling networks over the next ten years.

This will include running a series of local engagement events to enable residents and businesses to have their say and help shape networks across the county, as well as having input to school streets and liveable neighbourhoods.

Feedback from these engagement sessions will input directly into the design of the new routes.

The funding will also support several behaviour change projects, including:

- The introduction of some electric bikes to the Essex Pedal Power project
- More community cycling grants to support learn-to-ride sessions, free bikes for targeted groups, cycling festivals and taster sessions

COUNCIL TAX INCREASE TO MEET SERVICE DEMAND

Increased investment of £9 million in the repair and maintenance of roads and footpaths across Essex has been confirmed for the next year as part of our 2023/34 budget.

Supporting the vulnerable, improving infrastructure, ensuring pupils receive a high-quality education and help with the cost of living are at the heart of our budget, which was approved at Full Council on 9 February.

Factors including inflation, rises in energy prices and interest rates plus increased service demand have added £87 million more to our costs this year. Balancing these pressures with limiting the impact on household budgets means a Council Tax increase of 3.5% has been approved. This includes 1.5% council tax plus a further 2% ring-fenced to Adult Social Care.

WORKSHOPS FOR HOME EDUCATED PUPILS

EATING DISORDERS - SUPPORT FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

Online support is available for parents and carers of young people recently diagnosed with an eating disorder, but who have not yet started treatment. Beat, the UK's eating disorder charity, run a 10-week coaching programme over Zoom.

Sessions are weekly and run for 50 minutes. During each one, families will gain insight into their loved ones eating disorder. They will also understand their role in their child's journey to recovery. Learn more about the <u>referral criteria for eating disorders and how to get in touch</u>.

DISCOUNTED BROADBAND

Broadband providers are offering <u>discounted social tariffs</u> to help people who receive benefits to stay connected. These deals can save eligible households up to £144 a year on their broadband bills.

There are other benefits too, from fixed contract prices to no exit fees.
