HARE COURSERS CONVICTED

RET have secured an Essex first conviction of two males who travelled to Paglesham, Essex to hare course in January.

In what is also one of the first convictions in the UK, Tommy Gray of Buckighamshire and Joseph Abercromie of Kent pleaded guilty to the new offence of trespass with intent to purse hares.



Gray and Abercromie were seen trespassing on farmland and police were called. RET and local officers attended and caught Gray and Abercromie in fields with dogs.

RET work with six surrounding police forces to tackle hare coursing under Operation Galileo. Through this collaboration, we have reduced hare coursing by 50% this year compared to last season.

RET have convicted four people this season for coursing offences and obtained the first dog prohibition order in England.

The coursing season starts after harvest and runs through the winter until crops have grown too high to run dogs in fields.

If you witness hare coursing call 999 as it is a crime in progress. If you suspects hare coursing has taken place report it on the Essex Police website or via 101.

NOWHERE TO HIDE

RET have continued to target stolen vehicles and plant throughout July.

Criminals who steal vehicles and plant in Essex are actively targeted by the team.

In June and July alone, the team located 8 stolen vehicles.

A high value stolen Range Rover was located in Uttlesford.



In Chelmsford a stolen tipper truck was found.



Criminals often leave stolen vehicles for a 'soak' period to see if they have a hidden tracker device. During this period the team have an opportunity to search rural locations for hidden vehicles.

But its not just plant and high value cars.

In Colchester the team recovered a stolen moped. To its owner, its loss can have a huge effect on their ability to get to work or education, especially if they live in a rural area.


LIVESTOCK MARKET VISITED

A large field fire in Boreham called for immediate action and close working between RET, local officers and ECFRS.
