ACRE, (Action with Communities in Rural England) is managing a new £2.5m programme created by <u>Defra</u> that aims to help rural communities secure more small-scale, sensitively designed affordable housing schemes based on an assessment of local need. The programme, which runs until March 2025, will expand the network of Rural Housing Enablers (RHEs) across England. RHEs are professionals working for Rural Community Councils, who encourage communities to consider solutions

for meeting local affordable housing needs, and broker relationships with planners, landowners, and developers to identify suitable sites for development.

RCCE is delighted to confirm it has been successful with its bid to the new RHE programme. This will enable us to expand our rural housing service and we are currently recruiting an additional RHE to join our successful team.

RCCE MEMBERSHIP EVENING - WHAT WE CAN DO FOR YOU



RURAL COMMUNITY GREEN SPACES TO BE REJUVENATED THROUGH NEW GOVERNMENT INVESTMENT



Defra are creating a new fund that will boost access to nature and support rural communities across England to become more green-fingered. The new Community Green Spaces Fund will provide up to £7 million of funding to support communities across the country - from Northumberland to Cornwall - to create, restore and enhance their green spaces. Grants of up to £75,000 will be

provided to help communities to plant fruits, vegetables and trees, creating orchards and kitchen gardens for all to access and enjoy. Landscaping projects could also create raised beds and improve areas to plant different flowers around village hall facilities and other community green spaces, making space for pollinators and nature to thrive.
