Now open for applications for grant and Technical Support. DLUHC have extended the support for a seventh year (2024/2025). The Neighbourhood Planning Support Programme will continue to offer grants and Technical Support packages. Please apply via the Apply page of the Neighbourhood Planning website. The anticipated high demand for neighbourhood planning support means that it will be necessary to prioritise applications. The process for prioritising Technical Support applications will be determined by DLUHC, taking into account Government priorities such as housing, regeneration, climate change and environmental improvement.
