A Part time role with a fixed term until March 2025. This is an exciting time to join RCCE as we expand our team. You will work

with the Senior Rural Housing Enabler to promote the service across Essex and provide advice and guidance for parishes, including helping them identify their local housing needs and support them through the process of bringing forward a development. You will produce case studies, provide administrative

COMMUNITY AGENT - MALDON (SOUTH)

This is a permanent, home-based part time position.

Do you enjoy or want a rewarding role working for a local charity, supporting adults to live independently? (This is not a carers role). We are a network of people who provide advice and guidance to adults; in particular older people, but it can be anyone over 18 who requires a home visit to help them to remain living in their own homes. We're also here to help Informal carers. The job involves visiting people in their own homes – on an appointment system – and explaining the help and support that is available to meet their individual needs. It is not a personal caring role. The job is flexible to fit around personal/family commitments, working between 15 and 20 hours a week. To find out more please click here.

VCSE ENERGY EFFICIENCY SCHEME



A funding scheme to help voluntary, community, and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations in England improve their energy efficiency. The grant is available to those who supply frontline services in their communities. For example, having activities in the hall which work with the foodbank, offer debt advice or have a free lunch club or community hub. Although they are aware that many clubs and societies in halls offer support with social isolation and mental health,

the grant provider wants to see direct support with the cost-of-living crisis.

Applications will close in August 2024 officially, but demand has been constant, so this may be brought forward. All works need to be completed by March 2025 and you can only apply once. The FAQ section provides a lot of useful information for completing the application forms. Congratulations to East Hanningfield Village Hall who have successfully completed their solar panel project. This hall was successful in getting a grant from the Platinum Jubilee Village Halls Fund and campaigned hard to get other funding from local groups and other funders. On Saturday 20th April they held an Open Morning which was attended by user groups and suppliers, including Solar Green who completed the project on the hall.

This project will make a considerable financial difference to the hall, and they are happy to discuss the pitfalls and positives with any hall interested. They would also recommend Solar Green as a supplier.

The large grant allocation has been closed to stage 1 applications since the first round. However, there may be a possibility that the stage 1 application process will open again in the near future.
